








Southern Region Public Diplomacy Group members held a two-day team-building activity in New Orleans, Louisiana. Members got together from as far away as Texas.

On April 13, 2023, Eritreans residing in San Marcos and surrounding cities in San Diego County participated for the 20th time since 2003 at the Annual International Fair event at California State University of San Marcos (CSUSM).

Eritreans came out wearing traditional Eritrean outfits and participated in the Fashion show. In addition, they displayed traditional musical instruments, Ge'ez script, literature, and colorful cultural artifacts such as baskets.

Posters showing Eritrea's map and location, images of the nine beautiful Ethnic groups, the UNESCO World Heritage site of Asmara, its pristine beaches and coral reefs, and its beautiful landscape were shared with visitors.

A tri-fold brochure that gives a short account of the people, land, resources, history of Eritrea, and unique facts of Eritrea was handed out to the visitors from the various communities and groups who also had an opportunity to sample Eritrean food. Other participants at the Fair represented Haiti, India, the People's Republic of China, the Philippines, Native Americans, and University Departments.

The California State University of San Marcos, founded in 1989, is located on a 304-acre hillside overlooking the city of San Marcos, just a short distance from some of Southern California's best beaches and an hour from the U.S.-Mexico border. CSUSM enrollment is over 16,000, and the Western Association of Schools and Colleges fully accredits the university.



Medical equipment fundraiser continues across the US.

Eritreans residing in Portland & its environs public conducted а seminar Saturday, on April 22, 2023, led by Dr. Ghidewon Abbay. The seminar participants contributed about \$60,000 within one hour, totaling \$110,000 (including the \$50,000 Dr. previously Leul for the contributed) fundraiser aimed at sending modern machines for cancer treatment in Eritrea. The devices are expected to reduce the number of cancer deaths in Eritrea significantly.


